
Lovely Sisters Need a Home



Your Cat's Health: Ask the Vets at Cornell University



Q Is it really possible that my cat has acne?

A Yes cats do get acne. Humans and cats both have hair follicles with associated oil glands. When they get plugged, cats chins get swollen, are red, and develop pimples. After ruling out other skin conditions, your vet will advise warm water compresses and prescribe a topical product designed to help unplug the hair follicles.
