Your Cat's Health: Ask the Vets at Cornell University

Q How can I keep my cat safe over the Holiday Season?

A It is important to be aware of the various dangers that the holiday season can bring into our homes. Sparkly tinsel and pretty ribbon delights us, but can provide potential danger to our beloved pets. Poinsettias can indeed irritate the mouth and stomach of your cat, but lilies are even more toxic. Ingestion of even a tiny amount can result in kidney failure, so be extra careful of any plants that you or your guests bring into your home. We owners may find chocolate to be delicious, but it's never good for a cat to eat. Dark chocolate is the most dangerous because of its high levels of mehylxanthines. And for some cats, the stress and activities of the holidays can become overwhelming. You can try synthetic pheromones, such as Feliway, but the best solution may be to create a quiet, safe, 'cats only' room for your pet to seek comfort and peace.

Pope Benedict is well known as a cat lover. He used to feed the strays of Rome. During his recent visit to the UK he had an unexpected encounter with Pushkin, the Birmingham Oratory cat.

Fr Richard Duffield, Provost of Birmingham Oratory and actor for the cause of Blessed John Henry Newman, was responsible for the logistics of the beatification ceremony.

Fr Duffield was also responsible for ensuring that the Pope met a very important member of the Birmingham community. After private prayer in Cardinal Newman's room the Pope descended in a lift. As the door opened, right on cue, he heard a cat mewing, and looked pleasantly surprised.

The Provost ran after the Vatican TV crew and photographer who were exiting down the road and, on learning that the Pope was meeting the Oratory cat, they rushed back to record the historic encounter for posterity. Fr Anton Guziel, one of the community, went and fetched the half Persian black cat into the papal presence. The Pope was delighted to meet the cat sporting the papal colours, with a yellow and white ribbon about his neck. He inquired as to Pushkin's age -he is ten years old -and told the delighted feline that he was very pretty and then spoke to

him in "cattish German", stroking him and murmuring endearments.

Pushkin extended a paw to the Pope who took it smilingly. He stroked him under the chin and tickled his ears whilst Fr.Anton held him. According to Fr Anton, Pushkin maintained "a dignified and prayerful silence," throughout the happy encounter.










Photos from the 2011 Strawberry Tea






The Truth about Cats and Dogs

Unlike dogs, which exhibit a huge range of sizes, shapes and temperaments, house cats are relatively homogeneous, differing mostly in the characteristics of their coats. The reason for the relative lack of variability in cats is simple: humans have long bred dogs to assist with particular tasks, such as hunting or sled pulling, but cats, which lack any inclination for performing most tasks that would be useful for humans, experienced no such selective breeding pressures. *Scientific American, June 2009*
