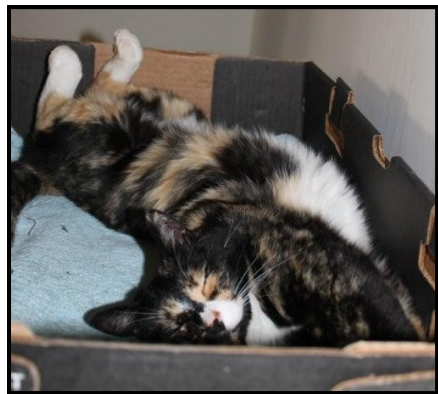




Adoption and Foster News

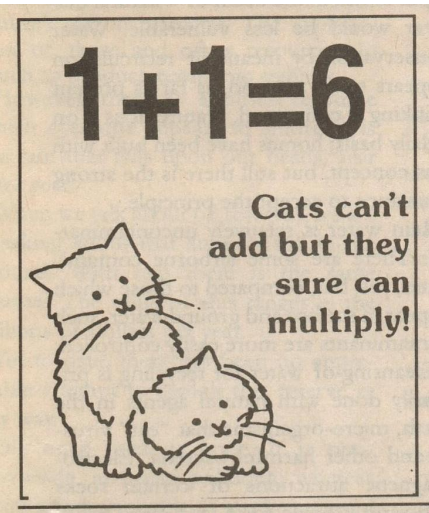

Our spay/neuter blitz was a great success – from February to April, we pledged almost 300 spays and neuters for cats belonging to low income people, as well as stray cats and ferals. Your Cat's Health: Ask the Vets at Cornell University

**Q.** My cat squints and is pawing at her red, irritated cloudy eyes. What might cause this condition and what are the treatments?

**A.** Infectious causes and some inherited conditions are among the possible culprits. Conjunctivitis is one possibility. Persians, for example, are more prone because of hairs irritating their more prominent eyes. Drops or ointment containing antibiotics or anti-inflammatory drugs may be prescribed by your vet. If feline herpes virus is the cause of the conjunctivitis, antiviral medications may be necessary. Another possibility is glaucoma, which once it starts in cats, can progress quickly, resulting in potentially permanent vision loss. Corneal ulceration may be the cause. This is an erosion of the surface of the eye, due to scratches, viral infection, dry eyes, ingrown eyelashes or eyelids that roll inward. Symptoms are the same as for conjunctivitis. This can be treated with topical antibiotics, oral antiviral medications, or possibly surgery. Good news: The prognosis is good with prompt and consistent medical care.

Spotlight on Members—Cecilie Davidson



Cecilie grew up in Victoria, and travelled quite a bit with her parents, who wisely believed that missing a term, or travelling on summer holidays provided a good extra education. Interspersed with working at the McPherson Library, being a parent, renovating houses, and running a janitorial business, she has always tried to keep a hand in with animal advocacy and some volunteering, and “oh the hours of online petitions and letters hand-written.” She feels that one is in fine company there, with members of thousands of causes actually effecting changes by flooding the inboxes of people who decide the fates of animals.

Both her Mum and her grandmother spent many hours of letter writing, meetings and advocacy back when dedicated people in Britain and a few in Canada were anti-vivisectionists. The “ant-vivvies” were among the precursors of the animal rights movement. Partly she was inspired by Mother Cecilia Mary who stood up to her superiors and ran the Good Shepherd Shelter at Cobble Hill. As a child she lived in fields of cabbages where Queenie the draught horse ploughed the furrows, and left Cecilie her shoe for good luck. Also inspiring were Tommy and Thora Bonneau (founders of VCRC) who walked the talk, and then some. Always with animals at home, she learned that they are not our play toys, that they are fellow sentient beings with character, and DNA remarkably similar to our own.

After some years of advocacy work, liaising with interesting people in wildlife protection, selling art to help fund anti-poaching units in India and Siberia, talking at luncheon meetings, getting people to march in the Victoria Day Parade, helping at bazaars, and holding several executive positions for VCRC, she currently finds herself more low key than before. Gone are the days of grabbing volunteers from the Wilderness Committee and others because she just had to mount an insta-demo with big signs and truck banners to tell Asia Pacific trade moguls to honour CITES and lay off tiger habitat. Occasionally she is still called out of the mid-island bush to tackle the bad guys harming wild salmon, or to hold placards at rallies. Mostly she keeps plugging away with petitions, helping the Qualicum Cat Rescue fundraiser, and of course she always looks forward to her bit for VCRC. (Cecilie has been in charge of the jewelry table at our fundraising events for years.) Cecilie says “Now that my cataracts are off I can do a better job! And I think about my tiny grandson and how I hope he will elevate animals too. For in so doing we elevate ourselves.”

We thank Cecilie for all she has done for animals, and particularly for her work with our society!
