

## President's Message-Fall 2015

It's November, so we're getting ready for our Christmas Tea and Bazaar on November 21 and looking forward to seeing everyone. Our storage locker is already overflowing with rummage items, so there will be lots for sale, as well as jewelry, books, and crafts – and of course the kitchen will be serving some delicious cakes. We're also going to raffle off some gift baskets just in time for the Christmas season. Hope to see you there!

We held our Annual General Meeting in September and we welcomed a new board member, Denis Brisson (see the box on the last page).

Project Purr, the kitten rescue project organized by United Hearts Animal Society, had a successful first year. The Society worked with Victoria Pet Adoption Society, Greater Victoria Animal Crusaders, Dee's Orphan Kitten Fund, and The Victoria Cat Rescue Corps Society over the summer to hold three events and take in, spay/neuter, and find homes for unwanted or stray kittens, pregnant cats, and nursing moms with litters. The activity isn't over but so far 50 cats have been helped:

- 32 kittens were surrendered or born to surrendered heavily pregnant moms. They will be re-homed and spayed/neutered when ready.
- 5 adult cats were surrendered to be spayed/neutered and re-homed.
- 5 owned cats were spayed/neutered and returned to their owners.
- 8 feral cats were spayed/neutered and re-homed through the Barn Cat program.

We attended the events and funded the spaying of adult females. It was great to see the good response.

Please keep an eye on the adoption page on our website. We're always looking for good foster homes and adoptive parents for our rescued cats. ## Regina Cat Rescue Names Kittens after Party Leaders

Justin, Tom, Stephen and Elizabeth were discovered on the street with their mum.

They are on the campaign trail raising money for spay and neuter surgeries. Not the leaders of Canada's political parties, of course, but their kitten namesakes — The Politicats.

The Regina Cat Rescue named four of its recently rescued

kittens after the politicians vying to become the next prime

minister. Rachel Molnar, communications co-chair of the Regina Cat Rescue, said the organization decided to have a little fun because the election is on everyone's mind. The "little party leaders" and their mum were discovered on the streets of Regina. There were three males and one female kitten. The names for the male party leaders were randomly given to the felines. "We're just disappointed there wasn't one more male for Gilles Duceppe," Molnar said. To tell the kittens apart they wear a collar in the colour associated with each party. A post on the Regina Cat Rescue's website read: "Justin, Tom, Stephen and Elizabeth love to challenge each other and can often be found sparring over important issues like use of the scratching post, access to the food dish and whose turn it is to snuggle with their foster mum." *Editor's note: the election will be decided by the time the SP goes to print, but we thought you might enjoy this story.*



#### Our Philosophy

The Animals are our brother creatures who share this earth with us and are equally deserving of our respect as well as compassion. It is indeed our moral duty to alleviate their suffering whenever and wherever possible. Perfect peace and harmony can never exist in this world if the plight of even one of its' creatures is ignored. If we were to solve all the problems of poverty, disease, and overpopulation and still somehow lacked the single quality of compassion, we would still have a world not fit to live in.

#### Our Purpose

The purposes of the Society are to promote an aggressive spay/neuter program for cats and dogs to reduce the stray population with its attendant suffering; to encourage euthanasia if it is clear that there is no other humane solution for an animal; and to offer monetary assistance to aid these goals regardless of financial circumstances. The Society's paramount concern being animal welfare, to educate towards responsible pet ownership and compassionate understanding of and respect for all living creatures, and to be a voice for all animals mainly through the Society's newsletter "The Scratching Post".
